The E-Santé Silver Economy project for a sustainable autonomy of seniors

The ALCOTRA E-Santé Silver Economy project (a French-Italian cross-border project on e-health) aims to bring together players in the health and medico-social sectors, senior users and companies offering solutions to prevent loss of autonomy and promote sustainable home care, both in urban areas and, more particularly, in the rural areas of the ALCOTRA territory.

The E-Santé project is divided into 3 phases: (i) focus groups to study the needs of seniors, (ii) living-labs to test the technologies resulting from the focus groups in dedicated environments (e.g. clinics and nursing-homes), and (iii) field-experiments to evaluate the feasibility of certain interventions and technologies in the ALCOTRA territory. The field-experiments started at the beginning of March 2022 after the completion of the two phases of focus groups and livings-labs. These experiments are mainly aimed at studying the feasibility of interventions, via several technologies (telemedicine, serious-games, tablets, remote communication tools, etc), both face-to-face and remote, for the stimulation of cognitive and physical capacities, as well as the social life of seniors on the ALCOTRA territory.

At the end of the field-experiments and therefore of the project (end of 2022), we will evaluate the technologies with the greatest impact in order to promote them and work towards a permanent deployment in the concerned territories and beyond. More info: <u>E-Santé Silver Economy project</u>

MOVIDIS project (ERASMUS+): 4th transnational meeting and a multiplier event in Cologne (Germany)

The FHM University in Cologne hosted the 4th transnational project meeting and multiplier event. The project partners had the opportunity to work on the different deliverables of the MOVIDIS project, once they have been evaluated by a group of expert evaluators. These deliverables are being updated and improved for future dissemination to the general public.

The results of this innovative project developed by these five universities, its teachers, administrative teams, international tutors and students will be made available to all organizations wishing to develop international virtual mobility.

REFACE project (ERASMUS+): The project working on building regions' resilience meet at Bilbao



Why should we talk about the concept of resilience in terms of adventure? Every adventure intrinsically brings certain uncertainties and unexpected events that go beyond our control. In the process of resilience building, we prepare ourselves for a "game of uncertainties" trying to anticipate possible dangers that might arise along

the way. ReFace project partners are continuing together this challenging adventure to strengthen the knowledge and skills in the field of resilience, in order to contribute to the reinforcement of current policies and measures used at regional level.

On 7-8th April, the international partnership met in presence in Bilbao (Spain), at FFE premises, for the first time since the onset of the project, due to the constraints imposed by the Covid-19 pandemic. During the meeting, partners discussed the developments achieved so far, the current status of the project

and jointly planned the next steps, with a special focus on the MOOC finalisation and testing phase, that will take place in the following months involving representatives of the public administration, University students, NGOs and other actors active in regional development.

Moreover, a first version of the Roadmap "Sustaining a resilient region – a tool for communities", was presented, summarising suggestions and resources to strengthen regional resilience levels for anyone interested in the topic. Project partners will soon meet again in Nice on the occasion of a training event on the topic of resilience, which will be organised by Université Côte d'Azur, to prepare the trainers who will lead the piloting of the MOOC. TEST project (ERASMUS+): academic teaching of STEM+A subjects. First operational meeting in Greece

The ERASMUS + TEST project, with the participation of Université Côte d'Azur, has just taken its first steps following the launch event held on 15 and 16 March in Patras (Greece).

The 24-month project will develop a prototype virtual laboratory for university teaching of STEM+A subjects, i.e. science, technology, mathematics and art. The project will promote and disseminate innovative teaching and learning methods through the construction of repertoires of practice for digital teaching and a professional development pathway for university teachers, especially in STEM+A

subjects.

At the kick-off meeting, which involved all European and national partners, the scientific network of the project was formalized. The project coordinator is Professor Alessandra Romano, University of Siena, Italy. In addition to the University of Siena, the partnership includes Italian and foreign bodies and institutions, such as: The Academy of Fine Arts of Naples, the consulting company Conform, the Spanish ECO digital learning and the Universitat Rovira i Virgili, the University of Patras in Greece, the Belgian non-profit association European Foundation for Management Development, the Austrian Universitat Fur Weiterbildung of Krems and the Croatian University of Zagreb.
