Launch of the ERC Advanced Grant 2023 "PANDORA" project. PI : Pr. Nicolas Coltice – Laboratoire Geoazur



September 1, 2024 was the starting date of the ERC Advanced erc Grant 2023 project "PANDORA" (GA. 101142672). The PANDORA project, funded by the European Research Council under Pillar 1 Scientific Excellence' of the Horizon Europe Programme for a period of five years, will be coordinated by Prof. Nicolas Coltice, a teacher-researcher in the Earth and Planet Dynamics team at the Geoazur laboratory, and his project team, and aims to identify how the dynamics of the Earth's interior, by building numerical sisters of the Earth, modulate the co-evolution of the surface environment and life. Prof. Coltice, researcher in history and dynamics of the Earth and the planets, is also co-founder of the didthistreallyhappen.net initiative, which combats ordinary sexism in the geosciences.



DigIT Africa project: Université Côte d'Azur represented by one of it's expert to lead a training session on the exploitation and use of immersive digital technologies and soft skills in education



From September 23rd to 26th, the University of the Balearic Islands, Spain hosted a study visit designed to train African academic partners, members of the Erasmus+ co-funded program "DigIT Africa". During this visit, an expert in digital technologies of UniCA, Mr Djibril Dieng, led training sessions on digital skills, covering emerging technologies such as Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Virtual Reality (VR) in education, as well as the use of

Creative Commons licenses for legal use of digital content. A Design Sprint workshop was also

organized, engaging participants in identifying and solving digital challenges within their universities.

This initiative strengthens cooperation between African universities, accelerating their way towards the digital transformation of Higher education institutions in Africa, and fostering innovative solutions to meet the demands of digitalization in the education ecosystem, in line with the objectives of the DigIT Africa project.



European LMQS project: Université Côte d'Azur welcomes Kazakh and Azeri delegations for two intensive management training courses in strategic health quality and risk management

June and July 2024 saw the completion of two weeks of advanced training courses for administrative and academic staff from Central Asian institutional partners.

The first course welcomed 17 academic managers and teachers for training designed to build their capacity to create curricula on health safety and healthcare quality management within their universities.

A second training session welcomed some fifteen members of the academic and administrative staff, and provided an opportunity to highlight and share best practices in healthcare training quality management, particularly through the innovative approach of digitalization.

These training sessions were made possible by the involvement and leadership of institutional experts in the field: Professors Pascal Staccini, Franck Dufour, Jean-François Carrasco and Lauren Cauro. The meetings also provided an opportunity for in-depth reflection on the development of initial and continuing online training courses in the field of quality and health risk management, which is the subject of work package no. 5

Official launch of the NEEMA project in Senegal to build capacity for food and nutrition resilience in the sub-Saharan region



On July 29, 30 and 31, a major project launch meeting was held in Dakar, bringing together all the academic partners of the NEEMA project, co-funded by the European Union. This ambitious project aims to provide universities in Burkina Faso, Mali, Niger and Senegal with tools, academic support and collaboration to strengthen the role and capacities of universities as major players in the ecosystem of nutritional security in West Africa.

This event, represented at Université Côte d'Azur level by two of its staff members, addressed key points concerning the significant progress made in the preparation of

country reports and the relevance of European best practices currently being studied by each of the project's European partners, including Université Côte d'Azur. The communication, dissemination and exploitation plan, for which UniCA is responsible, was also presented and studied for its implementation in the near future and throughout the next three years of the project.

_Ready, Immerse and Go!"- The Ulysseus Immersive VR experience



The "RIGO" (Immersive VR Experience for International Mobility) project, which brings together four universities in the Ulysseus Alliance, aims to carry out an interesting experiment based on the use of virtual reality for educational and psychological purposes.

This project, coordinated by the Université Côte d'Azur, is experimenting with virtual reality to train and develop specific skills for students who want to undertake international mobility or who simply want to try out these experiences virtually.

In May 2024, the first phase of the project was completed, based on a co-creation exercise in which students from the four partner universities shared their international experiences. This exercise revealed a number of challenging situations and complicated experiences of international mobility.

Due to the success of the conclusions of this co-creation exercise, the project partners have decided to produce a public version of the results and reflections of this exercise. This document will soon be published on the project website: <u>https://ulysseus.eu/rigo/</u>

The second phase of the project is currently underway, in which technicians from the project's the belo of a specialized company, will transform the situations identified by the students into virtual

partner universities, with the help of a specialized company, will transform the situations identified by the students into virtual scenarios with tools to help them deal with them in a safe and controlled environment such as virtual reality. In this way, the RIGO project aims to provide all students with a tool to improve their self-confidence when deciding to undertake international mobility.

Erasmus + project HYBOT - Project on the use of chatbots in higher education comes to an end



Since its launch in 2022, the HYBOT project, in which the Université Côte d'Azur is involved, has been working to explore the potential of hybrid teaching for universities and to develop new innovative concepts. Chatbots, i.e. intelligent virtual assistants, have been the subject of analysis and adaptation to the objectives of higher education because of the important role they can play in higher education, acting as digital assistants to teachers and taking over or supporting various functions.

In order to create and implement a good hybrid teaching concept based on chatbots, specialized knowledge and pedagogical skills were required, and therefore the project created training

courses aimed at developing the competences of university lecturers in designing and implementing hybrid learning and teaching scenarios using chatbots.

The project has also developed a handbook of good practices in hybrid teaching in Europe and worldwide, as well as a transnational 'community of practice'. University teachers involved in the project have developed their own hybrid scenarios and chatbots and tested them with students.

In the long term, the project aims to contribute to the modernisation of university learning environments and to increase the range of learning opportunities in the post-pandemic era.

European University Association: the expert group on "Learning and teaching to empower students" meets at Cardiff University, UK



On September 11-12, 2024 UniCA participated in the meeting of Thematic Peer Group "Learning and teaching to empower students" of the European University Association (EUA) at Cardiff University, UK. The group consists of experts in teaching and learning in higher education that discuss and explore good practices across the European Higher Education Area and publish a report with policy recommendations. Dr Natalia Timuş (DDIE) represents UniCA in this expert group.

During the two days the European experts had exchanged institutional practice in empowering students through ensuring relevant skills, student engagement, diversity, equity and inclusion policy, etc. The TPG group will meet again in November 2024 to start

the work on the group's final report, to be published in March 2025.
